We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the **Son**, forever and ever. Amen.

Thought for the week: 1st September is World Day of Prayer for the care of creation. Pope Francis is encouraging the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home. The Pope calls us to use the season to "cultivate our ecological conversion" and to pray together in "the great cathedral of Creation". He warns that we are reaching "a breaking point" and must act decisively so that "we and future generations can continue to rejoice in creation's sweet song of life and hope."

We're all in this together: Having travelled down south recently and seen how parched the land was, I can understand why people were running out and dancing in the rain to celebrate when it came. Did you go out and dance in the rain? What kind of things make you dance for joy? Life can sometimes be tough and every once and a while it's good to let those worries go and do your dance in the rain, or whatever makes you happy. We all need those breaks. Keep talking and remember what JK Rowling said, "It's important to remember that we all have magic inside of us."
