SYNOD 2021-2024 Communion Participation Mission

Last month the Newsletter item of 'Synod News'

reported that the Synod has reached the 'continental phase' with the issue of the 'Document for the Continental Stage', following the local and national listening sessions held earlier this year. The Vatican has announced that the Document is now to be sent to the local Churches as part of a 'restitution stage'. Bishop Mark explains: '... local bishops have been asked to facilitate a consideration of the three themes in a working document (the Document for the Continental Stage) produced at a meeting in Frascati. I have asked our synod team who prepared the synthesis for the Diocese to reconvene for this stage of restitution. The reflections will be forwarded to the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales for wider consideration.'

Please pray for the Synod and for our participation, walking together along the way, united in Christ, the Way, the Truth and the Life.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.
