PARISH PASTORAL PLAN DEVELOPED FROM PARISH SYNOD CONSULTATION

Pope Francis' Synodal Message:

"By growing together in Communion, the people of God deepen their Participation in the life of the Church and so become more effective Missionary disciples in the world".

Following on from the Synod responses last year and the subsequent implementation of the Parish Action plan, your Pastoral Council has been considering how the parish can be even more inclusive, engaging and outgoing – all topics raised by parishioners. In order to do this we need a lot more people to be actively involved – to deepen their participation in the life of the church- and we need financial support.

On the weekend of 30 September/1st October, Eileen Irwin and Colin Hedley will speak at Masses about how you can further support the parish financially.

As regards volunteering - your Pastoral Council has identified a whole range of areas which need your support, clarified what they are and how much time they demand.
