

NEWS FROM THE WIDER CATHOLIC WORLD: ST THERESA OF LISIEUX:

The Pope published a letter on St Theresa on 15 October to mark the 150th anniversary of her birth. He said St Theresa lived 'devoted to God, forgetting about herself, loving and consoling Jesus, and interceding for the salvation of all'. St Theresa's Jubilee Year ends on 7th January 2024.

WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER: The synod has started in Rome and runs until 29 October, with 363 participants. It consists of round table open discussions led by facilitators, with the inclusion on women for the first time and lay people. Discussions will be on the three main themes of communion, participation, and mission. The resulting summary report will then advise the Pope. And 2024 and 25 will see further stages. What we do know is that as a Parish we wanted to do more, be more inclusive and outgoing. This is our opportunity to put into action those things we felt as a community were important. KENNETH (KEN) THOMAS KILCOYNE 04.04.28 – 17.09.23 R.I.P.

A Tribute and Thanks



Ken, and his beloved wife Mary (who always persisted in calling him 'Kenneth'!), came to live in Chester, from their home in Yorkshire, at the end of the 1980's. They brought with them a wealth of experience of parish life and service, and settled close by St Columba's church, at 2 Church View, Newhall Road.

As a longstanding and devoted member of the Society of St Vincent de Paul, Ken soon joined the small SVP Conference serving the, then, parish of St Columba, to do his bit to bring some relief to the needy. He also joined the Readers of the parish and was distinctive in proclaiming the Word in his broad, unaffected, Yorkshire accent and, for a man of relatively slight build, surprisingly 'booming' voice. When Extra-ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion were eventually introduced in the parish, Ken was commissioned to be among them, to minister at Mass and in his work with the SVP.

In the early 2000's a vacancy arose for a Sacristan; Ken was invited to fill it and did so willingly and enthusiastically. From then on, he devoted himself to the role, sometimes sharing with others, but always setting the highest of standards in preparing for Sunday and weekday parish Masses and wider Diocesan celebrations. Bread and wine provisions attended to, Sacred vessels, vestments and linen lovingly cared for, candles carefully trimmed, and holders cleansed.

Ken had been an Altar Server from his youth. He would often recall his experience of serving at the Latin Mass, with a hint of regret that something had been lost in modern liturgy. Nevertheless, when he was Sacristan, Ken began when necessary to serve again at the Altar, bringing his long experience to bear with great reverence. There is a record somewhere of the number of Masses Ken served in his lifetime; they were many!

This brief account of Ken's life of service in the parish is a tribute and thanksgiving, marking his death on 17th September, but it would not be complete without some mention of Ken's wife, Mary. They were a 'team', each supporting the other in their service to the Church. Mary excelled in her own ways of service; she was for example, a tireless worker for the Catholic Women's League, and Altar linen and funeral pall, products of her handiwork, continue in use in St Columba's church.

In these Synod days, as the parish of SS Columba and Theresa seeks to encourage all parishioners to offer their God given talents to the life of the parish and wider community, the likes of Ken and Mary are perhaps an S.O.S; not a distress call but Signs Of Service, to give us hope. Good and faithful servants, may they rest in peace and rise again with Christ in His glory.
