As part of CAFOD's <u>Fix the Food System</u> campaign, over 70,000

Catholics from across England and Wales had signed the letter in solidarity with Salina to urge the World Bank to stop supporting policies that limit small farmers' choice over which seeds they can use. Thank you for your support
