We're all in this together _ Peace Sunday 2024 is this Sunday, 14 January and the theme chosen by Pope Francis is 'Artificial Intelligence and Peace'. "The Bishops of England and Wales invite us to make today a day of prayer for world peace, using the theme proposed by Pope Francis. It might seem a strangely technical, rather abstract title, of limited interest except to experts. But new technologies are developing so quickly that we need to think about their consequences for our freedom, peace and security. Who is gaining power through AI – and who is being disempowered? We also need to think of the risk of Artificial Intelligence, which will only have as much soul and ethical vision as those who programme it, calling the shots on the battlefield, deciding who lives and who dies - and possibly one day even triggering wars automatically. " (Pax Christi) We need to understand better this new world and what it means. The blurring of the boundaries between truth and falsehood, what is right and what is wrong. We need to be informed to understand better and act accordingly.
