LEAKS IN ST.COLUMBA'S CHURCH:

A cherry picker was used to examine the church roof this week to try to find the source of the leaks. Some remedial action was taken but we need to monitor the situation to see if the action was effective. If you notice wet carpet or water running down a wall it would be very helpful if you could let me know directly or via the church office. The two areas of leaking are: - on the wall behind the altar especially on the right hand side: - down

the wooden column on the opposite wall (where the varnish is peeling off) to the left as you come in to church. Sadly, don't bother reporting any water leak you may see in the front porch, to the right as you enter church, as years of investigation have proved that it is impossible to find the source and we just have to live with Pauline Rourke
